

**NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION
SPRING STREET
SEWER REPLACEMENT AND REHABILITATION**

August 5, 2008

Attention Abutters:

The Watertown Department of Public Works announces the start of construction for the replacement and rehabilitation of sewers along Spring Street. The project will fix identified sewer defects and reduce the amount of infiltration and inflow (I/I) into the sewer system. I/I is extraneous groundwater and rainwater that enters the sewer system through defects. I/I contributes to higher sewage transport and treatment costs and lessens the capacity of the sewer system. The project is being funded using the MWRA Community Financial Assistance Program.

You are receiving this notice since you are an immediate abutter to the project area. The project will include construction activities such as trench excavation and backfill, by-pass pumping, reconnecting of sewer services, paving, restoration of disturbed surface areas, traffic control, erosion and sediment control, and site clean-up. The project will use two processes and be completed in two phases.

Tornare Construction of Watertown, MA will be responsible for construction of replacement sewers along Spring Street. Once the replacement sewers have been constructed, Insituform Technologies of Chesterfield, Missouri will be responsible for installing Cured-In-Place-Pipe liners to rehabilitate sewers that do not need full replacement.

Construction will begin within the next few days and work is anticipated to be completed this fall. Final cleanup and paving restoration activities will be necessary.

Work hours will generally be between 7:00 am and 4:00 pm Monday through Friday. There may be dust and/or noise generated by the work and minor traffic inconveniences. Sewer, water or other utility services may be disrupted at times.
